STRENGTHENING POST-GRADUATE SUPERVISION



SHORT LEARNING PROGRAMME FOR SUPERVISORS

The Short Learning Programme is aimed at strengthening postgraduate supervision capacity across the sub-Saharan Africa Higher Education system, deepening the understanding of supervision as pedagogy. The course content takes into account the diverse contexts in which supervisors work as well as the differences in the postgraduate supervision processes across different disciplines. The programme includes eight units that aim to strengthen your capacity in managing the supervision process, in developing scholarship in your students and in applying various models of supervision. The pedagogical approach of this online course draws on participant interaction with the online interface, participant reflexivity to enable learning from supervision experiences and reading of relevant research. It is an online programme taught through Moodle and complemented by weekly Zoom live sessions.

Target audience: The programme is intended for academics who supervise postgraduate students and their studies in the African Centres of Excellence with at least 3 years of experience in supervision.

Facilitators: Prof Naydene de Lange and Prof Mathabo Khau (both Nelson Mandela University, South Africa).
